# 1. Decisions of the Interreg Monitoring Committee of 7th December 2021

### 1.1 State of progress of the Interreg Indian Ocean programme

The committee noted the progress made by the programme, notably characterised by a rate of programming of 99 % and a certification rate of 38 % as on 31/10/2021. The automatic decommittement on 31/12/2021 will be crossed after the December appeal for funds.

The committee is informed of the strains that the health crisis has put on the dynamics of the programme; since March 2020 air links difficulties in the Indian Ocean has severely constrained implementation of cooperation projects.

In 2022 programming and certification efforts will continue but the results will be strengthening linked to the health crisis evolution and the travel restrictions in the Indian Ocean.

### 1.2 Changes in the Interreg V Indian Ocean Programme

The committee approved the modification of the financing plan and indicators of the Interreg V Indian Ocean programme.

The adjusted programme will be officially forwarded to the European Commission for approval.

# 1.3 Update on assessments and communication of the Interreg V Indian Ocean programme

The committee noted the thematic evaluations of the Interreg V Indian Ocean programme carried out respectively in 2020 and 2021.

Evaluation reports will be officially sent to the European commission.

The committee also noted communication actions carried out in 2021, with increased involvement of the Indian Ocean Interreg programme in national and european communication campaigns.

# 1.4 Preparation of the Interreg VI Indien Ocean programme (2021-2027)

The committee noted the work on the Interreg VI programme carried out since march 2020 especially the consultations organized with local partners and third party states. These consultations have made it possible to obtain 9 third party states agreements to take part in the next Interreg programme (Mauritius, Seychelles, Comoros, Madagascar, Kenya, Tanzania, Maldives, Australia and India). In addition, positive responses from the Departmental Council of Mayotte, the IOC and the TAAF were received.

The committee noted the schedule for further work with expected approval in the second half of 2022. In addition, discussions will continue with third party states to draw up new framework agreements with the Regional Council of Reunion.

The committee noted the will of the Departmental Council of Mayotte to establish consultations for liaison with the Interreg Mozambique Channel.



## Implementation of the Interreg V IO programme

Programme adopted in September 2015, first projects programmed in July 2016, high programming dynamics in 2017 and 2018 First funding amendment in early 2019 to maintain the programming dynamics Impact of the health crisis in en 2020-21 on the implementation of programmed projects, due to the long period of closure of regional air transport

Second amendment of the financing plan in December 2021 to consider this particular context

### **PROGRAMMING**

- 229 supported projects
- Total amount : €73.4 M, representing 99% of the model


 12 projects in the progress of being approved, for a total eligible cost of €1.7M, i.e 101% of the budget

### **CERTIFICATION**

- <u>Total amount</u>: €28.5 M, representing 38% of the model
- FORECAST BY THE END OF 2021
- Significant effort to certify in the second half of 2021, which should allow us to cross the OD threshold with an advance of €1.2 M
- Call for funds on December 17 and 18, 2021
   Evolution of certification since the beginning of the program (total cumulated cost)











### Forecast for 2022



Programming objective of €10 M in 2022 to reach a programming rate of 115%

€11.6 M certification objective to cross the 2022 OD threshold (€ 37.7 M/€ 44.3 M total cost)

- Implementation of a monitoring of the certifications of each office from the end of 2021
- Priority to the mobilization of partners (forwarding of supporting documents) and the certification of expenditure

Persistence of the health crisis – programme only with third countries and projects heavily dependent on air transport



### **EDF-ERDF** coordination

- ➤ New in 2021 : EDF funding granted directly to PIROI and CIRAD, for operators also supported by the ERDF Interreg on joint projects
- ➤ **The need** to define more detailed coordination procedures, at processing and payment of the projects
- ➤ However the opportunity to mobilize these funds for additional expenses (INTERREG IO does not support expenses directly incurred by foreign partners due to the complexity of the audit rules)

The Commission asks to specify the articulation between the EAFRD and the INTERREG programme in terms of agricultural cooperation (research and training).	In terms of mobility and training, INTERREG finances projects with a regional dimension carried out in partnership with research and training structures in the Indian Ocean (division lines indicated in section 6 "Coordination" of the OP adopted in 2015).	
	The EAFRD only finances the training of active farmers, and INTERREG IO only finances people in initial and vocational training.	
It also asked for clarification on the distinction between the European Erasmus programme and the REUNION project carried by the University on axis 10.	The REUNION project is carried out in partnership with universities in the area, implies a reciprocity of exchanges (entry and exit of teachers and students), and is an initiative specific to Reunion Island.

Comments on the programme change	Details provided by the managing authority
The European Commission reminds that the indicators must represent at least 50% of the amount of each axis.  For axis 6, it will be necessary to verify if the previous indicators are still enough to cover the majority of the expenses of the axis.	After verification, and on the basis of the latest budget forecast transmitted by PIROI, in November 2021, the contribution of the INTERREG programme to this infrastructure would be 2.3M€, or 52% of the amount of the axis.  Therefore, a new indicator is proposed, inspired by those included in the 2021-2027 regulations (and in particular the RCO024)  — Value of investments in new disaster response systems (m² built)


